Fueling Your Future

In the summer of 2016, an after-school STEM program at The ROCK was an unsolidified concept. The trending buzzword, often accompanied by details about its impact on youth, was increasingly being seen and heard in newspaper articles, blogs, and casual conservation. The ROCK has the target age group and an influential audience, no doubt about that. Many students even form their STEM identity, like many other careers, before they reach high school age. The picture to be painted, involved giving (all) students at The ROCK an opportunity to be exposed to different STEM concepts through fun & engaging hands-on experiences. "ROCKit" did just that.

Since ROCKit's inception in December, 2016, there have been over 300 student hours and 230 unique participants across 2 coding clubs, 1 science club, 6 organization-led demonstrations, and 12 unique projects. ROCKit enables students to continue earning, while having fun, after the school day ends. The collage included with this article can speak clearly about the variety of opportunities this newly developed program has contributed to The ROCK's after-school environment.

We ended the school year with our 2nd highest attended project ("slime" being the 1st) led by a fabulous group of volunteers from the American Foundry Society (AFS) – Saginaw Valley Chapter. After being briefed on the topic of metal casting, students selected a pre-made design, created a mold in a sand mixture, and turned it over to one of the AFS volunteers to fill the mold with melted (450° F) tin. Students were able to take their creations home with them as a souvenir.

We look forward to extending ROCKit into the (2017) summer with two 4-day camps -Mad Scientist Week & Space Week. Also, stay tuned to The ROCK's Facebook page for new ROCKit projects and opportunities being added next school year!

August 7-10 Space Camp _ This week will be out of this world as we train to be astronauts and travel to outer space. We'll explore space science, launch rockets, and learn about the planets in our galaxy.
